Lesson #21

This is another issue which is very important today; children really do need to be protected while using the internet. There is no way for them to know with whom they are talking on-line. On-line safeguards are vital; restricting access is very important.

Do the children realize the internet has a patron saint? The Scripture references were chosen to show the children that the care of God is reflected in their parents' care for them.

The prayer given provides another opportunity for discussion about their use of the internet.

This lesson will need to be handled differently with the different ages of the children. With the younger ones, there may not be need for much discussion. The older ones could be invited to discussion about just how they handle themselves on-line. Do they give out personal information? What do they do if someone contacts them? What do they do if they find themselves on a site which they know they should not be visiting?

This lesson could easily be combined with the one on pornography with the older children.

A Prayer before logging onto the internet:

Almighty and eternal God, who created us in your image and bade us to seek after all that is good, true and beautiful, especially in the divine person of your only-begotten Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech you that through the intercession of St. Isidore, bishop and doctor, during our journeys through the internet we will direct our hands and eyes only to that which is pleasing to you and treat with charity and patience all those souls whom we encounter.
