The Ego/Fame Lure

Lesson #12

This lesson centers on the call to empty ourselves in order to fully serve God. Christ's example of complete submission to the Father's will in completely emptying himself and taking human form is always before us. This lesson makes a wonderful contrast to the lesson on self esteem. A good sense of personal dignity is important; a strong sense of self is, too. Problems arise when this is grows into egotism.

In the world today, children are over-exposed to famous, often infamous, people. They see, often without recognizing them, the problems which can result from egoism. In an 'all about me' world, being a follower of Jesus Christ is not easy.

The Scripture references are not about being famous; they are about service to others, putting others first. They are about rewards not of this world. The Way of the Lord is summed up by the quote from Mark's gospel: "you shall love your neighbor as yourself." MK 12:31 The beatitudes from Matthew's gospel show us a different way to live. Later, we are reminded not to store up treasure in this world, but in heaven where it cannot be destroyed. We are told to become like a child, completely depending on and trusting in God in order to enter the kingdom.

As symbol, the crucifix is on the one hand universally known; yet was a scandal. Fame, attached to the Cross, would not be seen as a good thing in today's world. Christ's teachings and example of 'other-centeredness' is counter cultural to us.

The Sign of Peace is more than simply a greeting to those around us, it is an opportunity for reconciliation.
