



## **The Playmate/Friendship Lure**

### **Lesson #18**

The children will have many stories to share about their friends. What makes someone a friend? Why are friends important to us? How is someone a good friend? How can they be friends to one another?

Who were Jesus' friends? What does the song mean that we have a friend in Jesus?

The prayer for friendship is an opportunity to expand the discussion with the children.
