Concerning the Respondent

I understand that according to Church Law, my request for a Declaration of Nullity cannot be considered unless my former spouse is contacted and offered the opportunity to testify. I agree to make every effort to locate my former spouse for the purpose of participating in the process. This effort includes, but is not limited to, previous known addresses, securing the social security number to assist in locating my former spouse should previous addresses prove useless, and performing an internet search for my former spouse in areas of probable residence.

Concerning the Witnesses

I understand that witnesses are necessary in order to authenticate my testimony and validate my basis for an annulment.

I agree to make every effort to present complete information regarding witnesses requested by the Tribunal and to elicit their cooperation when necessary. This includes their complete legal names, current addresses, telephone numbers and my relationship to them.

Concerning the Expenses

I understand that one does not pay for an annulment and that the fee requested is to assist in covering the cost of office procedures, most of which is covered by the Diocese.

I agree to pay a portion of the expenses incurred in my case. In addition to the Filing Fee of \$100.00, I agree to pay the remaining amount of \$700.00 in two stages:

- \$ 400.00 will be required at the time of the Petitioner's interview.
- \$ 300.00 will be required <u>before</u> the case is put on the docket for a decision.

I understand that these non-refundable monies (\$800.00) are not payment for an annulment which, in accordance with Canon Law, will be judged solely on the basis of grounds and sufficient proof from witnesses, but for the expenses of the annulment process which I will incur regardless of the outcome of the case.

There is an additional fee if a psychological evaluation is needed. Should an appeal of the decision be made to the Roman Rota, there is an additional fee of \$850.00 which will be required from the party which is making the appeal to Rome, in addition to a \$200 preparation fee.

The following questions, while lengthy and detailed, are intended to give the complete background of the total relationship of the parties to the marriage now being questioned. On separate paper, answer all of the following questions in detail, being sure the answer for each question has its appropriate number. [Please type or print clearly.]

- 1. Describe your parents. How was your relationship with them?
- 2. Describe your relationships with any siblings.
- 3. Do you recall any serious issues or problems in your family of origin? Was there any abuse of drugs or alcohol? Were there any other addictive behaviors of note in your immediate family?
- 4. Did you or any close relative ever experience any sexual abuse or any other type of abuse (physical, emotional, etc.)?
- 5. Describe your educational background. Overall, how did you feel about school?
- 6. Were you ever a member of the military? If so, what was that experience like for you?
- 7. Did you ever have any problems with the law? If so, what were they?
- 8. Did any of your siblings ever exhibit significant problems (divorce, personal problems, etc.)?
- 9. Did you ever experience significant physical or mental health problems? If so, please explain.
- 10. Before you met your former spouse, describe your dating history. Were you ever previously engaged or married? If so, explain the reason for the breakup.
- 11. Prior to meeting your former spouse, did you have any children?
- 12. Was there any other important information about your family that was not discussed in the above questions?

- 31. Were both of you faithful to each other during the engagement?
- Were there any breakups or separations during your courtship and engagement? Please explain. Who initiated the reconciliation and why?
- 33. Were there any special problems or unusual circumstances during the courtship or the days just before the marriage? If so, please describe them.
- 34. Did either of you have any grave or serious doubts or reservations about the marriage or each other before you married? If so, please explain.
- 35. Did either of you place any conditions on the marriage? If so, please explain.
- 36. Did anyone advise you against the marriage? If so, please explain who and why? How did you react?

- 37. What part did each of you play in planning your wedding? Did anyone interfere with your plans?
- 38. Was there pre-marital sexual activity? Did this influence your decision to marry in any way?
- 39. Was there any premarital pregnancy? If so, did this influence your decision to marry?

Wedding and Marriage

- 40. Did both of you feel that you entered into marriage freely and happily?
- 41. If you felt less than free in your decision to get married, why?
- 42. At the time of your marriage, did you and your former spouse intend a permanent life-long union until death? If not, explain what you intended.
- 43. At the time of your marriage, did either of you believe that divorce could be a possibility?
- 44. In entering marriage, how serious were you and your former spouse about having children? Were there any discussions, agreements or disagreements regarding children? If so, what were the results of the discussions?
- 45. At the time of the marriage, did either or you intend to delay having children or permanently exclude children?
- 46. If children were excluded, why were they excluded? Did goals, values and aspects of lifestyle or career conflict with parenthood? If so, what and why?
- 47. What means, if any, were used to avoid conception? Was contraception always used? Would either of you refuse to have intercourse without a form of contraception? Was intercourse ever open to conception?
- 48. Did either of you undergo some surgical procedure, such as a vasectomy or tubal ligation, as a means of contraception? Who? When? How was this decision made and why?
- 49. At the time of the marriage, did you both intend to commit yourselves to only one another for life? If not, what did you intend?
- 50. At the time of the marriage, what did you understand "marital fidelity" or "being faithful" to mean?
- 51. At the time of the marriage, did either of you ever discuss giving each other the freedom to see others during the marriage? If so, please explain.
- 52. At the time of the marriage, did either of you envision a situation when it would be acceptable to have sexual relations with another person? For example, to retaliate for infidelity by your former spouse, if one of the parties was unwilling or unable to have sexual intercourse, etc.?
- Were both of you, in fact, faithful to each other? If not, please give details about when infidelity began, how often it occurred, etc. Why did this happen?
- During your engagement and at the time of the marriage, did you intend to give your former spouse the right to equality in mutual decision making?

- During your engagement and at the time of your marriage, how did the two of you agree to handle your finances? In practice, how were the financial responsibilities handled?
- 56. Did you or your former spouse intend to marry someone possessing specific qualities/values and later discover that these qualities/values were not present? If so, please explain.


